



Acadience Reading



Acadience testing is the state mandated testing for Kindergarten through 3th grade. It tests reading proficiency through phonemic awareness, phonics, accuracy, fluency, retelling of the reading and comprehension.

RISE



RISE is the state mandated test for 3rd through 6th graders. It tests proficiency in Language Arts, Math and Science. The graph to the left shows how Fox Hollow compares to state and district RISE scores.


