EARTHQUAKE	School will follow earthquake procedures (duck and cover). Students will stay in classrooms unless they are unsafe. In this case, students will be moved to a safer area. FIRE	School will follow fire procedures. Students will exit the school and move to predesigned areas.	A command center will be set up (most likely in the back of the school or a safe distance from the fire). Staff will release students to a parent (or designee on the School Emergency form).
LOCKDOWN	School will follow lockdown procedures. Students will remain in their classrooms or safe location until the building is cleared by a police officer.	Parents will be directed to a command center to wait for their students. Classes will be released by staff and sent to the command center. Students will then be released from the command center to a parent (or designee on the School Emergency form).
MISCELLANEOUS IN ROUTE (BUSES)	Blizzard: Decisions to keep children at school will be based on road conditions and safety. Chemical Spill: "Shelter-in-place" procedures will be implemented.
