Message from Our Principal



A Pretty Great School

Legacy Elementary has received results of statewide testing, and we are pleased to report excellent results for our school. 91% of students, grades 3-6, demonstrated proficiency in language arts. 90% of students demonstrated proficiency in Mathematics. More importantly, this represents improvement in both of these areas and meets a school wide goal set last year. Legacy made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) based on criteria established by the federal No Child Left Behind Act. During 2010-2011 Legacy Elementary continued its focus on improving student writing. This spring 98% of 5th grade students passed the Statewide Persuasive Writing Assessment! 94% of our students school wide met benchmarks established for writing at our school.

School Land Trust Funds were used to focus on language arts, specifically writing. These funds were used to purchase technology for classrooms, software for writing, and to provide time for teachers to administer reading assessments. Funds were also used to provide aide time to assist students in language arts. This year's grant will again be used to increase student achievement in writing and in reading.

Great teachers, supportive parents, and diligent students make this progress possible. We are working to continue to improve student achievement and hope

your children will benefit from two interventions taking place this year. "Den Time" will occur each week for thirty minutes with students in grades 1-6. During Den Time students will receive additional instruction for improvement or for enrichment in specific areas of the curriculum. These objectives are identified by teacher teams during Monday collaboration meetings. Every student participates in Den Time as part of his or her school day. In addition, some students will be invited to participate in Legacy's "Booster Club." This before and after school program will target specific areas of language arts and math. It will include only a few students at a time and is focused on providing additional support for learning.



Welcome back to the Legacy Cafeteria 2011-2012!

We are very excited to start a new year with you again. Nutrition Services has been very busy to help provide nutritious meals for each of your students. We are concerned for those students with special needs which include allergies to milk, peanuts, shellfish, fish, wheat and other circumstances. Please feel free to come in anytime. We will try to be accommodating to your situations. Thanks for your patience.

We have a few changes this year which will be very helpful to all students and parents:

- A) Parents are still able to access their student's meal balances by registering with MealPayPlus.com
- B) Nutrition Services will make every effort to notify parents when their student is out of money.
- a. We will notify students the day before their account is in deficit. They will be receiving a deficit meal the next day for lunch if a payment is not received.
- b. We will stamp the student's hand when they are out of money.
- c. We will send home a weekly deficit letter for the parent.
- C) Elementary students with charges over \$6.00 will be offered a deficit breakfast for a charge of 40 cents and a deficit lunch for 75 cents.
- a. Deficit breakfast-----white or chocolate milk and graham crackers 40 cents.
- b. Deficit lunch---white or chocolate milk and grilled cheese sandwich 75 cents.
- D) Free and reduced meal benefit applications are available at the school office at any time.
- a. Applications for free and reduced meals are made yearly. If you have not done so, please do this immediately. It takes 10 days to receive notification.
- E) The cost of a carton of milk has increased to 30 cents from 25 cents. Please make sure your student brings enough change or you can put money into his or her account and it can be taken out each day they want milk with a sack lunch.
- F) The cost of a preschool meal has increased to \$2.50.
- G) Parents, grandparents and special friends are encouraged to come and eat lunch with their student at a cost \$2.50. Our special days are Thanksgiving and Christmas but you are welcome anytime.
- H) As they come through the lunch line each day, we would encourage your 1st grader to practice saying their last name first.
- I) Fuel Up To Play 60 is our new activity which we encourage all our students to participate. Our goal is to help the students increase access to and consumption of affordable and appealing fruits, vegetables, whole grains, low-fat dairy products and lean meats in and out of school. Stimulate students to be more physical active for 60 minutes every day in and out of school. Educate and motivate students to eat the recommended daily servings of nutrient rich foods and beverages. Empower students to take action at their school and at home to develop their own pathways to better fitness and nutrition for life.

There is a program at fueluptoplay60.com where your student can go and track their activity and food consumption each day. Here at the Legacy kitchen we will reward students who participate in this each month with prizes for their good work.

We look forward to seeing you this year and have a great day.

Dropping Off and Picking Up Students

Student Arrival: Thank you for helping your student arrive safely and on time. Please be sure students are always dropped off at the curb. A quick goodbye and drop-off will help us to avoid congestion and is appreciated. Parents of preschoolers may briefly stop and exit their car to sign in students. Students should always use the crosswalk.

Caution Drivers: Traffic on the road in front of our school increases at drop-off and pick-up times. Stopping along red curbs is not allowed. U-turns in front of the school are prohibited.
