Business items

• Minutes from last meeting approved-Motion by Tami Galbraith, 2nd by Rachel Baldwin and the vote was unanimous.

Discussion items

- Data Review: K-3 will be using the DIBLES (*Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills*) assessment this year in addition to DRA. DIBELS is required by the state. Testing is administered in one day by a team from Alpine School District. DIBELS is a quick assessment that gives a benchmark based on fluency, accuracy, and some comprehension. Combined with results from DRA, teachers use it to guide instruction. Mr. Gibb shared 1st grade data from the fall assessment. The winter assessment will be given on January 20 and give comparison data for teachers to use. Both tests are used to measure progress and growth.
- Collaboration Incentive: New Rubric from the district. Will schedule members to come and participate in collaboration Monday during March.
- Digital Citizenship: Sample documents from other schools were shared with the council. The document "Keeping our Students Safe Online" from Alpine School District's Technology Dept. was shared with the council. Mr. Gibb gave an inventory of what devices are used at the school, what they are used for and how they are managed. There was discussion on what is being done teach students to be safe online. Legacy will combine Red and White Ribbon week this year. NetSmartz does an assembly each year. The students receive instruction in computer class. NOVA is a program for 6th graders. Any personal devices brought to school by students are not to be used at school unless they have been given permission and are supervised. The council determined to prepare a draft of a Digital Citizenship document for discussion and approval at the next meeting. Mr. Gibb will prepare the draft. It was suggested that a parent meeting be held also.
