Last summer, I had the opportunity to attend a conference about intervention for all students. This conference really made me reflect on the individual student. The presenter kept saying, "You can't look at the school as a whole when it comes to student achievement. You need to look at each student and standard to know if each student is making growth." At Traverse Mountain Elementary we are able to discuss and collaborate about the individual student each day.

The Utah State Office of Education has implemented a new student accountability system called the Utah Comprehensive Accountability System (UCAS). The resulting accountability system provides a straightforward determination of school performance and supports the design principles by valuing performance on state tests, prioritizing individual student growth toward meaningful achievement targets, promoting equity for low performing students, and incentivizing attainment of graduation and college/career readiness.

As noted in the Proficiency Chart, Alpine School District performs above the state in all three subjects. Congratulations to students, parents, and faculty as our school's proficiency and growth places us in the 99th percentile. 



TRUSTLANDS REPORT

For the 2011-12 school year, our school used \$24,376 from the school trustland program to partially fund an additional teacher, various teacher aides, and teacher professional development. With these components, we were able to better reach our goals by having small group reading and math groups for remediation and enrichment.

Our goals for 2012-13 are similar in that we will track students three times a year by administering a grade level common math and reading assessment. We have also added a writing component. Teachers use the early out time on Mondays to realign curriculum to meet differing needs of students in each grade level. Be sure to read the full report on our webpage.

Funding for 2012-13 in the amount of \$33,755 is being used to fund an additional teacher, teacher aides, and a new computer lab.

The PTA has organized many great activities and advocates for each child at Traverse Mountain.




