IMPORTANT INFORMATION

A.L.L. TESTING

Various programs are necessary to meet the diverse needs of academically advanced students. In order to address some of these needs, Alpine School District has established elementary classes at an advanced level for third through sixth grade called A.L.L. We have a 5th and 6th Grade A.L.L. program at Cedar Ridge Elementary.

ADDITIONAL SIGNIFICANT INFORMATION TO CONSIDER:

The A.L.L. candidates must qualify for the program through a series of evaluations. The top students are offered placement, and an additional four to six become alternates in a "candidate pool."

A.L.L. students will have assignments/homework that are greater in depth, breadth and complexity than in a regular class.

If you feel that your child could benefit from placement in an Advanced Learning Lab (A.L.L.) and you would like to begin the consideration process start by registering them at: https://www.xpressbillpay.com/portal/payment_forms/?id=MzMyOQ%3D (%3D). Registration closes three days before each scheduled testing date.

Please take time to find your child's ASD student number (example 947312). This number should be sent with the child to testing as well for labeling purposes.)



CEDAR RIDGE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL'S INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

With the recent change in weather, we thought it would be a good time to send home our policy about inclement weather days.

Ideally, students would be outside as much as possible before the morning bell rings and during recess. This allows the children to play under supervision and the teachers to get ready for the day.

Children are expected to dress appropriately for the weather. In cold weather, we would expect children to come to school in coats, hats, and gloves. When there is a slight drizzle, children would be expected to wear waterproof jackets or to use an umbrella.

We have the children come into the school only when the weather makes it necessary. We follow these guidelines to call an inside day:

*The temperature is below 21° F (including windchill)

*The precipitation is such that a child would remain wet for long periods of time

*The wind is excessively strong

*The air quality is excessively bad

Children who decide for themselves that they would prefer to stay inside are invited to sit inside a doorway and quietly talk to a friend or read a book.

ASD Advanced Learning Lab (A. L. L.) Testing Saturdays – January 11th to February 1st 2014

The Alpine School District (ASD) Gifted Services department will be conducting 8 sessions of testing for placements in the district A. L. L. classrooms for the 2014-15 school year. Any interested 2^{nd} grader through 7^{th} grader in ASD is invited to attend a testing session to qualify for a placement in an Advanced Learning Lab (A. L. L.). The testing will occur according to the schedule below. All 2^{nd} , 4^{th} and 6^{th} graders interested in a placement for the next year will **have to test** to be placed in a two-year program (unless currently enrolled in a 4^{th} grade A.L.L. program with a completed intent to continue form). 3^{rd} , 5^{th} and 7^{th} graders may test for openings that may occur in an established class.

Testing for both Elementary and Secondary Advanced Learning Lab (A. L. L.) programs will be done on Saturdays, January 11th to February 1st. The online registration is open and close 3 days prior to each testing session. There will be a \$20.00 fee for the testing. Registering within three days of testing is considered a late registration and will incur an additional \$5.00 fee. Free/Reduced lunch students need to register in person at the district office PDC (575 N 100 E American Fork).

If you have children testing for both Elementary and Secondary, please make plans to test on separate days, arrange for help with rides, or build in extra time to deliver children to the separate tests.
